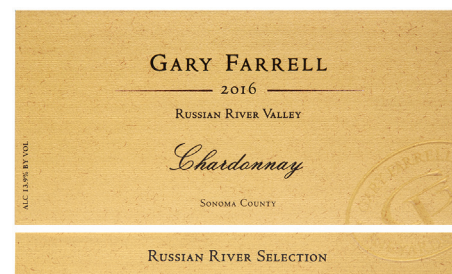

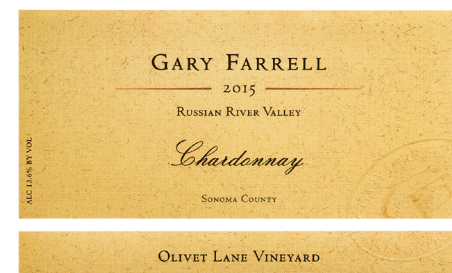

Medium-bodied, lightly textured and clean, it’s slightly mid-weight yet is nicely balanced and offers ample pleasure. Drink it over the coming couple of years.”

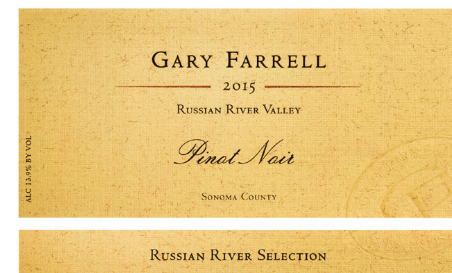
“The 2015 Chardonnay Olivet Lane Vineyard has slightly more depth and richness than the Russian River Selection as well as higher acidity. Stone fruits, white peach, crushed rocks, and buttered citrus notes all flow to a racy, tight, vibrant Chardonnay that has good fruit and depth on the palate. It’s going to benefit from a year or two of bottle to age and drink nicely for 4-6 years.”

“The 2015 Pinot Noir Russian River Selection is a classic, well-made California Pinot Noir. Spiced cherries, raspberries, flowers, and subtle smoky, earthy notes all flow to a medium-bodied, balanced, elegant wine that’s already drinking beautifully, yet is capable of keeping for 5-7 years.”



2015 HALLBERG VINEYARD PINOT NOIR

“The 2015 Pinot Noir Hallberg Vineyard is from a site in the Russian River Valley and spent 16 months in 40% new French oak. Deeply ruby-colored and offering a beautiful nose of mulberries, blackberries, wood smoke, spice and underbrush, it’s medium-bodied, seamless, and silky on the palate. It’s a classic, Côte de Nuit look-alike that will drink nicely for a decade.”
